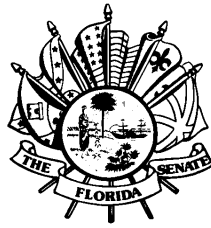

CS/CS/SB 8 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance, Senator Negrón and others—

Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud; Establishes the Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud Strike Force within the Department of Financial Services to coordinate efforts to eliminate Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Provides for proceeds of the additional court cost or surcharge to be deposited into the Rape Crisis Program Trust Fund or the Domestic Violence Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/CS/SB 434 (2R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Sobel and others—

Suicide Prevention Education; Deletes references to inactive organizations represented by members of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council and replaces with active organizations. Requires that district school boards provide access to suicide prevention educational resources to all instructional and administrative personnel as part of the school district professional development system. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1148 (2R) by the Committee on Higher Education and Senator Rich—

Postsecondary Student Fees; Clarifies an exemption from fee requirements provided for a student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of a relative under the Relative Caregiver Program or who was adopted from the DCFS after a specified date. Provides that the exemption remains valid for 4 years after the date of graduation from high school, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1216 (2R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Negron and others—

Children's Services; Requires the governing body of the county to submit to the electorate the question of retention or dissolution of a special taxing district created to provide funding for children's services. Prescribes a schedule for submission of the question to the electorate. Provides for the application of the act to certain special districts in existence before and after the act's effective date. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Emergency Medical Services Personnel/Training/HIV; Deletes the requirement that any person who applies to be certified or is certified as an emergency medical technician, paramedic, or 911 emergency dispatcher must complete an educational course approved by the Department of Health regarding the human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immune deficiency syndrome, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1818 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health Regulation—

Blood Establishments; Prohibits local governments from restricting access to public facilities or infrastructure for certain activities based on whether a blood establishment is operating as a for-profit organization or not-for-profit organization. Requires that certain blood establishments disclose specified information on the Internet. Exempts certain blood establishments from the requirements to be permitted as a prescription drug manufacturer and register products, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 2100 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Wise—

Biomedical and Social Research; Repeals provisions relating to the Center for Health Technologies and the Florida Biomedical and Social Research Act. Deletes provisions and cross-references to conform. Repeals provisions relating to the Cervical Cancer Elimination Task Force and the Florida Cancer Council. Provides the goals for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committees on Higher Education and Health and Human Services Appropriations, report the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 2138 (2R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Gardiner—

Health Care; Repeals a provision relating to a prohibition against applying the Drug-Free Workplace Act retroactively. Repeals a provision relating to the investigation of complaints regarding hospitals. Provides requirements for an alternative administrator of a home health agency. Transfers administrative responsibility for the application procedure for federally qualified health centers from the DOH to the ACHA, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 2790 (2R) by Senator Negron—

Grants and Donations Trust Fund/DFS; Creates the Grants and Donations Trust Fund within the Department of Financial Services. Provides for the purpose of the trust fund and sources of funds. Provides for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund. Effective Date: Contingent.

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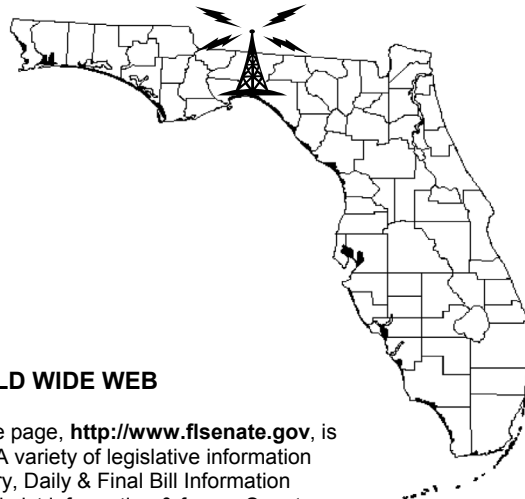
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
