### BILLS ON THIRD READING

#### **POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING**

#### **CS/CS/SB 8 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance, Senator Negron and others—**

**Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud;** Establishes the Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud Strike Force within the Department of Financial Services to coordinate efforts to eliminate Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to prepare model interagency agreements that address Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Establishes the Division of Public Assistance Fraud within the Department of Financial Services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

*Read the second time on April 15, 2010*

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#### **CS/CS/CS/HB 159 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council, the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Legg and others—**

**Guaranty Associations;** Exempts workers' compensation claims under employer liability coverage from application of specified requirements; authorizes insurers to recoup specified assessments levied by OIR; expands application of state law to specified residents of other states who own insurance policies; expands list of contracts & policies to which life & health insurance guaranty of payments provisions do not apply, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 2232 (SUB) (Richter) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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#### **CS/SB 2046 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—**

**Employee Leasing Companies;** Deletes the requirement that an employee leasing company obtain approval of the Board of Employee Leasing Companies before changing the name or location of a company. Specifies that the regulatory requirements applicable to employee leasing companies do not affect the eligibility of such companies, their clients, or leased employees for any local or state tax credit, economic incentive, or other benefit, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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#### **HB 7117 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Kreegel—**

**OGSR/Funeral, Cemetery & Consumer Services Board;** Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemptions from public meetings & public records requirements for Board of Funeral, Cemetery, & Consumer Services within DFS & for certain information held by DFS; requires recording of closed meetings wherein licensure examination questions or answers are discussed; creates public record exemption for recordings of closed meetings, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for CS/SB 1660 (SUB) (Richter) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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#### **HB 7119 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative K. Roberson—**

**OGSR/Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology;** Requires recording of closed meeting of Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology or of rate proceeding on insurer's rate filing at which confidential & exempt trade secrets are discussed; creates public records exemption for recording of closed meeting; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for CS/SB 1658 (SUB) (Richter) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 2264 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance and Senator Bennett—**

**Property Insurance Claims;** Provides statements that may be considered deceptive or misleading if made in any public adjuster's advertisement or solicitation. Requires that a disclaimer be included in any public adjuster's written advertisement. Requires certain persons who act on behalf of an insurer to provide notice to the insurer, claimant, public adjuster, or legal representative for an onsite inspection of the insured property, etc. Effective Date: 06/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/SB 2230 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—**

**Pub. Rec./Examination Techniques & Procedures/OFR;** Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information that would reveal examination techniques and procedures used by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to the Florida Securities and Investor Protection Act. Provides an exception to the exemption for other governmental entities having oversight or regulatory or law enforcement authority. Provides for future review and repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/HB 885 (3R) by the Rules and Calendar Council, the General Government Policy Council, Representative Tobia and others—**

**Life Insurance;** Exempts certain life insurance agents from certain continuing education requirements under certain circumstances; specifies nonapplication of required notice to current insurer of policy replacement; provides limitation on resale of specified annuities to third parties; prohibits creating or permitting of specified classes of employees for group health insurance policy purposes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **SB 1364 (SUB)** (Thrasher) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 661 (3R) by Representative Nelson—**

**Surplus Requirements/Mortgage Guaranty Insurers;** Authorizes Commissioner of Insurance Regulation to permit temporary exception to specified minimum surplus requirements under specified circumstances; revises authority of OIR to take action against noncomplying insurers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for **SB 2084 (SUB)** (Richter) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 1736 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Commerce and Senator Garcia—**

**Unemployment Compensation;** Provides for retroactive application. Establishes temporary state extended benefits for weeks of unemployment. Provides for state extended benefits for certain weeks and for periods of high unemployment. Specifies the duration of liens securing the payment of unemployment compensation tax obligations. Provides for the treatment of a single-member limited liability company as the employer for purposes of unemployment compensation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/SB 1114 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Gelber and others—**

**International Commercial Arbitration;** Cites this act as the "Florida International Commercial Arbitration Act." Defines the scope of application of said act. Provides intent that the act be applied and interpreted with respect to its purpose. Limits the ability of a court to intervene in an arbitral proceeding. Designates the circuit court in which an arbitration is or will be held as the court that may take certain actions authorized by the act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 2014 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Commerce and Senator Wise—**

**Early Learning;** Deletes an obsolete reference to the repealed subsidized child care program. Replaces an obsolete reference to a repealed program with an updated reference to the school readiness program. Establishes the Gold Seal Quality Care program within the DCFS. Revises procedures for child care market rate reimbursement and child care grants. Revises provisions relating to statewide kindergarten screening and kindergarten readiness rates, etc. Effective Date: 05/31/2010 except as otherwise provided.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 2330 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Commerce and the Committee on Commerce (Garcia)—**

**Department of State/Government Accountability Act;** Reenacts a specified provision relating to the establishment of the Department of State. Assigns various duties of the Executive Office of the Governor relating to notaries public to the department. Renames the State Library Council. Requires state agencies to furnish copies of state publications to the Library of Congress. Deletes provisions establishing The Grove Advisory Council, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 985 (3R) by Representative Van Zant and others—**

**Peddling at Camp Meetings;** Repeals provisions relating to peddling at or within specified distance of any camp or field meeting held for religious purposes. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for **SB 2128 (SUB)** (Wise) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 53 (3R) by Representatives Lopez-Cantera, Ray and others—**

**License Plates;** Creates St. Johns River license plate; establishes annual use fee for plate; provides for distribution of use fees received from sale of such plates. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for **SB 304 (SUB)** (Jones) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 7089 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Holder—**

**OCSR/Florida Self-Insurers Guaranty Association;** Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemptions from public records & public meetings requirements for Florida Self-Insurers Guaranty Association, Inc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1662 (SUB)** (Richter) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**SB 2470 (3R) by Senator Thrasher—**

**Regional Transportation;** Creates the Northeast Florida Regional Transportation Study Commission. Provides for the Jacksonville Transportation Authority to staff the commission. Provides for funding of the commission. Provides for the commission to make available to the public its meeting minutes, reports, and recommendations and publish its reports and recommendations electronically, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**SB 488 (3R) by Senator Lynn—**

**Vehicle Registration Forms/Voluntary Contribution;** Requires motor vehicle registration application forms to provide for a voluntary contribution to Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc. Provides for the use of such funds. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/SB 768 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Constantine—**

**Luis Rivera Ortega Street Racing Act;** Creates the "Luis Rivera Ortega Street Racing Act." Revises penalties for violating provisions prohibiting certain speed competitions and exhibitions. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**SB 1082 (3R) by Senator Lynn—**

**Driver's License Restrictions;** Restricts the number of passengers under the age of 18 permitted in a vehicle operated by a person under the age of 18 unless accompanied by driver at least 21 years of age. Provide exceptions. Provides for secondary enforcement. Provides penalties. Provides for applicability. Provides citation procedures for a violation of such restrictions. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 320 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Commerce and Senator Garcia—**

**Household Moving Services;** Redefines the term "storage." Provides for the biennial renewal of mover and moving broker registrations. Authorizes the DOACS to extend registration expiration dates in order to establish staggered dates. Authorizes a mover to exclude liability for household goods packed by the shipper under certain circumstances. Prohibits a mover or moving broker from conducting business without being registered with the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 1048 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Judiciary, Regulated Industries and Senator Baker—**

**Construction Bonds;** Requires that a contractor record in the official records a payment bond for a public works construction project. Prohibits the issuing authority for a building permit or a private provider performing inspection services from inspecting the property being improved until certain documents are filed. Revises requirements for demands for a copy of a construction contract and a statement of account, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**SB 1150 (3R) by Senator Dean—**

**Registration/Farm Labor Contractors and Employees;** Requires the renewal of farm labor contractor and employee certificates of registration under certain circumstances. Requires the DBPR to suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew certificates of registration under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 1152 (3R) by the Committees on Regulated Industries, Banking and Insurance, Senator Bennett and others—**

**Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services Act;** Revises qualifications for the membership of the Board of Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services. Authorizes the waiver of certain provisions during a state of emergency. Authorizes fees for certain inspections of licensees. Prohibits the issuance or renewal of a license to an applicant that has specified criminal records under certain circumstances. Authorizes a licensing authority of the DFS to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 846 (3R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries, Senator Bennett and others—**

**Residential Fire Sprinkler Requirements;** Prohibits incorporation into the Florida Building Code certain mandatory residential fire sprinkler provisions of the International Residential Code. Provides an exception. Prohibits the requirement of property owners to install fire sprinklers in residential properties based on the use of that property as a rental property or any change in or reclassification of the property's primary use to a rental property. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

**POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, ENVIRONMENT, AND LAND USE [EPSC] GROUPING**

**SB 1166 (3R) by Senator Altman and others—**

**Community Residential Homes;** Prohibits certain rules adopted by the APD from restricting the number of facilities designated as community residential homes located within a planned residential community. Authorizes the agency to issue a license as a comprehensive transitional education program to serve children who have severe behavioral conditions. Defines the term "planned residential community," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2010; and further amended on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 282 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Bennett and others—**

**Review/DCA/Florida Government Accountability Act;** Reenacts provisions relating to the establishment of the Department of Community Affairs and relating to the establishment of the Florida Housing Finance Corporation. Repeals a specified provision relating to the repeal of the Florida Faith-based and Community-based Advisory Council. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

**HB 1013 (3R) by Representative Plakon and others—**

**Citrus Canker Eradication;** Repeals provisions relating to citrus canker eradication program & payment of compensation to eligible homeowners whose citrus trees have been removed under program. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for SB 1956 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**SB 2226 (3R) by Senator Baker and others—**

**Off-highway Vehicles/ROV;** Redefines the term "ROV" to include vehicles of an increased width and weight. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

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**CS/CS/SB 982 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities and Senator Bennett—**

**Underground Facility Damage Prevention & Safety;** Prohibits municipalities, counties, districts, and other local governments from enacting ordinances or rules that conflict with ch. 556, F.S. Provides that if an excavation is proposed within 15 feet of a high-priority subsurface installation and is identified as such by the facility operator, the facility operator must notify the excavator of such installation and mark its location before excavation may begin, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 1377 (3R) by Representative Fresen and others—**

**Telecommunications Companies;** Repeals provisions relating to: rates, tolls, contracts, charges, rules, regulations, performance of service, & maintenance of telecommunications facilities; fixing rates by PSC; consideration of directory advertising revenues when establishing rates; changing rates, tolls, rentals, contracts, or charges; schedule for implementation of price regulation; procedures for interim rates, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for SB 2646 (SUB) (Ring) and read the second time on April 21, 2010*

**POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING**

**CS/SB 2580 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Gaetz—**

**Group Insurance for Public Employees;** Requires that school districts procure certain types of insurance through interlocal agreements. Requires that each school district in this state enter into a specified type of interlocal agreement and establish the School District Insurance Consortium. Requires that the consortium be governed by a board of directors consisting of a specified number of members. Requires that the DMS provide technical services to the consortium, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Read the second time on April 21, 2010*

**CS/SJR 72 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation, Senator Baker and others—**

**Health Care Services;** Proposes the creation of Section 28 of Article I of the State Constitution, relating to health care services.

*Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010*

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**HB 1 (3R) by Representative Porth and others—**

**Statutes of Limitations;** Designates act "Jeffrey Klee Memorial Act"; eliminates statute of limitations for wrongful death actions for intentional torts resulting in death from acts described in specified provisions relating to murder & manslaughter; provides for application. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program;** Provides legislative findings and declarations for the tax refund program for qualified target industry businesses. Establishes a schedule for the OTTED to review and revise the list of target industries and submit a report to the Governor and Legislature. Revises the criteria for the OTTED and Enterprise Florida, Inc., to use in identifying target industries. Redesignates the economic-stimulus exemption as the "economic recovery extension," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

**Seaports;** Provides for port conceptual permits. Provides that approval of certain submerged lands authorization by the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund constitutes the delegation of authority to the DEP for final agency action. Requires the DOT to include certain projects' funding allocations in its legislative budget request and to submit specified work program amendments within a certain timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Authorizes a property owner to apply for funding and enter into a financing agreement with a local government to finance certain improvements. Authorizes a local government to collect moneys for such purposes through non-ad valorem assessments. Authorizes a local government to incur debt payable from revenues received from the improved property, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Requires the Office of Policy and Budget within the Executive Office of the Governor to maintain the state's financial data on the state website for a specified period, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

**Property Tax;** Creates an exception from the assessment of back taxes on property that was not assessed by a property appraiser. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

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
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
