CS/CS/CS/SB 724 (MR) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Review/DCFS/Florida Government Accountability Act; Reenacts and amends a specified provision relating to the establishment of the Department of Children and Family Services. Revises licensure requirements for family day care homes. Revises provisions relating to lead agencies. Requires that a guardian ad litem be appointed by the court to represent a child in the custody of the DCFS who is prescribed a psychotropic medication, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2010; Read the third time, amended, and passed as amended on April 22, 2010; and Motion to Reconsider having been made by Senator Aronberg and adopted on April 22, 2010

CS/CS/SB 8 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance, Senator Negron and others—

Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud; Establishes the Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud Strike Force within the Department of Financial Services to coordinate efforts to eliminate Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to prepare model interagency agreements that address Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Establishes the Division of Public Assistance Fraud within the Department of Financial Services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 15, 2010

CS/SB 2230 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Pub. Rec./Examination Techniques & Procedures/OFR; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information that would reveal examination techniques and procedures used by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to the Florida Securities and Investor Protection Act. Provides an exception to the exemption for other governmental entities having oversight or regulatory or law enforcement authority. Provides for future review and repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2010

CS/CS/SB 1736 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Commerce and Senator Garcia—

Unemployment Compensation; Provides for retroactive application. Establishes temporary state extended benefits for weeks of unemployment. Provides for state extended benefits for certain weeks and for periods of high unemployment. Specifies the duration of liens securing the payment of unemployment compensation tax obligations. Provides for the treatment of a single-member limited liability company as the employer for purposes of unemployment compensation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 200 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Baker and others—

Parole Interview Dates for Certain Inmates; Extends from 5 to 7 years the period between parole interview dates for inmates convicted of violating specified provisions or serving a mandatory minimum sentence under a specified provision. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 21, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1818 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health Regulation (Gaetz)—

Blood Establishments; Prohibits local governments from restricting access to public facilities or infrastructure for certain activities based on whether a blood establishment is operating as a for-profit organization or not-for-profit organization. Requires that certain blood establishments disclose specified information on the Internet. Exempts certain blood establishments from the requirements to be permitted as a prescription drug manufacturer and register products, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/SB 400 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Fasano and others—

Programs to Prevent Violence; Requires that an additional or increased court cost or surcharge be assessed against a defendant who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is found guilty of, regardless of adjudication, certain specified criminal offenses. Provides for proceeds of the additional court cost or surcharge to be deposited into the Rape Crisis Program Trust Fund or the Domestic Violence Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/CS/SB 434 (3R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Sobel and others—

Suicide Prevention Education; Deletes references to inactive organizations represented by members of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council and replaces with active organizations. Requires that district school boards provide access to suicide prevention educational resources to all instructional and administrative personnel as part of the school district professional development system. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 22, 2010

SB 808 (3R) by Senator Oelrich and others—

Murder/Unlawful Distribution of Methadone; Provides that murder in the first degree includes the unlawful killing of a human being which resulted from the unlawful distribution of methadone by a person aged 18 or older when such drug is proven to be the proximate cause of death of the user, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/HB 7165 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative K. Roberson—

OGSR/Domestic Violence Fatality Review Teams; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for specified identifying information in records created by domestic violence fatality review team & exemption from public meetings requirements for specified meetings of domestic violence fatality review team. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for **SB 884 (SUB)** (Storms) and read the second time on April 22, 2010*

HB 7113 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative McBurney—

OGSR/State Child Abuse Death Review Committee; Saves from scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act exemption from public records requirements for information held or obtained by State Child Abuse Death Review Committee or any local committee & exemption from public meetings requirements for specified meetings of committee or local committee; defines term "local committee"; reorganizes provisions, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 920 (SUB)** (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 22, 2010*

CS/CS/HB 1005 (3R) by the Criminal & Civil Justice Policy Council, the Committee on Public Safety & Domestic Security Policy (CCJP) and Representative Holder—

Corrections; Revises criminal penalties for offenses concerning sexually transmissible diseases; eliminates penalty of criminal quarantine community control; prohibits person in correctional facility from committing lewd or lascivious exhibition in presence of employee; requires that DOC electronically send Parole Commission monthly list of inmates released & offenders terminated from supervision who may be eligible for restoration of rights, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/SB 960 (SUB) (Dockery) and read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/HB 341 (3R) by the Committee on State Universities & Private Colleges Policy (EPC), Representative Coley and others—

H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center & Research Institute; Revises provisions relating to establishment of institute & specifies primary responsibilities; conforms provisions relating to agreement by Board of Governors & not-for-profit corporation for use of facilities; specifies that corporation & its not-for-profit subsidiaries shall conclusively act as instrumentalities of state for purposes of sovereign immunity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1022 (SUB) (Storms) and read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/CS/SB 1050 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Baker and others—

Ephedrine or Related Compounds/Sale; Prohibits obtaining or delivering to an individual in a retail sale any nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation containing ephedrine or related compounds in excess of specified amounts. Requires a purchaser of a nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of ephedrine or related compounds to meet specified requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

HB 521 (3R) by Representative Proctor and others—

Compact/Educational Opportunity/Military Children; Abrogates future repeal of Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; deletes provisions relating to disclosure of information & records & closure of meetings by Interstate Commission on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; provides for future legislative review & repeal of compact. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for SB 1060 (SUB) (Storms) and read the second time on April 22, 2010

HB 7115 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Ambler—

OGSR/I.D. of Minor/Waiver/Termination of Pregnancy; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for information that could identify minor which is contained in record relating to minor's petition to waive notice requirements when terminating pregnancy; makes editorial changes; expands exemption to include such information held by office of criminal conflict & civil regional counsel or Justice Administrative Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/SB 1198 (SUB) (Negron) and read the second time on April 22, 2010

HB 7087 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Holder and others—

OGSR/Guardians Ad Litem; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for identification & location information of current or former guardians ad litem & spouses & children thereof; expands exemption to include names & locations of schools or day care facilities attended by children of current or former guardians ad litem; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/SB 1200 (SUB) (Negron) and read the second time on April 22, 2010

CS/SB 2262 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Thrasher—

Charter Schools; Revises requirements for providing financial statements to the sponsor of a charter school. Authorizes a governing body to oversee multiple charter schools. Provides requirements for designation as a high-performing charter school. Authorizes such a charter school to increase enrollment and receive capital outlay funds. Provides for the establishment of charter virtual schools, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Wildlife Regulation; (THIS BILL COMBINES S318 & CS/S572) Prohibits the import or release of nonnative animals in this state unless authorized by the FWC. Requires that any person or entity wishing to keep wildlife in captivity or sell specified species of wildlife obtain a permit from the FWC. Requires that the FWC annually evaluate the placement of additional species on the list of reptiles of concern beginning by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Excludes certain premiums for federal multiple-peril crop insurance from calculations for an insurer's gross writing ratio. Removes an exception relating to the examination of managing general agents, etc. Effective Date: 06/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

OGSR/Voters and Voter Registration/Signatures; Amends provisions relating to an exemption from public records requirements for certain information regarding voters and voter registration and for signatures of voters and voter registration applicants. Creates said exemption for specified personal identifying information of stalking victims held by the Attorney General or contained in voter registration and voting records held by the supervisor of elections or the Department of State, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 2252 (SO) by Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates the authority of members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires that persons addressing a legislative committee take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Provides criminal penalties for certain false statements before a legislative committee. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance card in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

**CS/SB 2530 (SO) by the Committee on Health and
Human Services Appropriations, Senator
Alexander and others—**

Nursing; Authorizes the disclosure of certain confidential information required of nursing license applicants to certain persons. Revises requirements for graduation from certain nursing education programs for nursing license applicants seeking to take the licensing examination. Revises restrictions on nursing graduates who may use certain titles and abbreviations. Revises requirements for the approval of nursing education programs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation, Higher Education, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 1337 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation, Higher Education, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Health and Human Services Appropriations*

**CS/CS/SB 1216 (SO) by the Committees on
Community Affairs, Children, Families, and Elder
Affairs, Senator Negrón and others—**

Children's Services; Requires the governing body of the county to submit to the electorate the question of retention or dissolution of a special taxing district created to provide funding for children's services. Prescribes a schedule for submission of the question to the electorate. Provides for the application of the act to certain special districts in existence before and after the act's effective date. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committees on Finance and Tax, and Health and Human Services Appropriations, report the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1306 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Public Assistance; Revises terminology relating to the food stamp program and the WAGES Program to conform to current federal law. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1676 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Higher Education (Oelrich)—

OGSR/Commission for Independent Education; Amends a specified provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for investigatory records held by the Commission for Independent Education and an exemption from public meetings requirements for a probable cause panel wherein exempt information is discussed. Requires a recording for any portion of a closed meeting of a probable cause panel. Provides for limited duration of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/1/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 1678 (SO) by the Committee on Higher Education (Oelrich)—

OGSR/Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute; Repeals a provision relating to an exemption from public records requirements for certain records held by the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute. Saves the exemption from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/1/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Higher Education and Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1734 (SO) by the Committee on Higher Education and Senator Oelrich—

Emergency Medical Services Personnel/Training/HIV; Deletes the requirement that any person who applies to be certified or is certified as an emergency medical technician, paramedic, or 911 emergency dispatcher must complete an educational course approved by the Department of Health regarding the human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immune deficiency syndrome, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 2144 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Detert)—

OGSR/Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program; Amends a specified provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for records of children in the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program. Makes editorial changes. Reorganizes the section. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 2750 (SO) by Senator Dean and others—

Provides for enforcement as a secondary action. Provides penalties. Provides for the suspension of a person's driver's license for a violation of a specified provision. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.


