BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 2230 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Pub. Rec./Examination Techniques & Procedures/OFR; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information that would reveal examination techniques and procedures used by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to the Florida Securities and Investor Protection Act. Provides an exception to the exemption for other governmental entities having oversight or regulatory or law enforcement authority. Provides for future review and repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2010

*Similar to **CS/HB 1059 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability*

CS/SB 2262 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Thrasher—

Charter Schools; Revises requirements for providing financial statements to the sponsor of a charter school. Authorizes a governing body to oversee multiple charter schools. Provides requirements for designation as a high-performing charter school. Authorizes such a charter school to increase enrollment and receive capital outlay funds. Provides for the establishment of charter virtual schools, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 22, 2010

SB 1258 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture (Dean)—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requires that the department and representatives of the state pest control industry prepare a report for the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of specified legislative committees by a certain date. Requires that the report include recommendations for changes in the law to provide for disciplinary action against licensees of pest control industry under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 23, 2010

CS/CS/SB's 2210, SB 1552 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Regulated Industries , Senators Constantine and Fasano—

Appraisers & Appraisal Management Companies; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2210 & S1552) Increases the number of members on the Florida Real Estate Appraisal Board. Requires the Florida Real Estate Appraisal Board to adopt certain rules. Requires application, registration, and renewal fees for appraisal management companies. Requires such companies to register with the DBPR. Requires nonresident appraisal management companies to consent to commencement of actions in this state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010

*Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 303 (HC)** in the Committees on Regulated Industries, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and General Government Appropriations*

CS/SB 1918 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Aronberg—

Traffic Offenses; Provides penalties for the commission of a noncriminal traffic infraction or certain other violations that cause or result in the serious injury of a motorcyclist, bicyclist, pedestrian, or person of other means of conveyance. Provides enhanced penalties for such violations that cause the death of such person. Provides that the act does not prohibit the person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010; read the third time and with pending amendment #1 (barcode 373254) by Aronberg on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/CS/SB 2182 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Community Affairs, Agriculture and Senator Alexander—

Agriculture; Clarifies that land that is classified as agricultural retains that classification when offered for sale. Provides the methodology for assessing certain structures or improvements used for horticulture production. Revises provisions of the Florida Aquatic Weed Control Act. Provides that the executive offices of the Department of Citrus are located in Bartow, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

Similar to CS/CS/CS/HB 981 (HC) in the Committees on Agriculture, Community Affairs, Finance and Tax, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/HB 131 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Adams and others—

Absent Uniformed Services and Overseas Voters; Defines "absent uniformed services voter" & revises definition of "overseas voter"; requires supervisor of elections to notify absent uniformed services voter & overseas voter of free access system for determining absentee ballot status; provides timeframe for absentee ballot to be sent to each absent uniformed services voter & overseas voter, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 900 (SUB) (Thrasher), read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

CS/SB 1948 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Gaetz—

Road Designations; Designates Perdido Key Parkway in Escambia County. Designates Colonel Bud Day Boulevard in Okaloosa County. Designates Orange Bowl Way in Miami-Dade County. Directs the Department of Transportation to erect markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/SB 570 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Constantine and others—

Environmental Protection; Revises the greenhouse gas reporting requirement for major emitters. Requires all public entities and those entities occupying buildings managed by the DMS to report recycling data to the county using the format designated by the DEP. Provides for the creation of a voluntary recyclers certification program. Revises requirements for review of new waste-to-energy facility capacity by the DEP, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010; and further amended on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/SB 2074 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Peaden—

Agriculture; Prohibits a county from enforcing certain limits on the activity of a bona fide farm operation on agricultural land under certain circumstances. Creates the "Agricultural Land Acknowledgement Act." Requires an applicant for certain development permits to sign and submit an acknowledgement of certain contiguous agricultural lands as a condition of the political subdivision issuing the permits, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 26, 2010

Similar to CS/HB 7103 (HC) in the Committees on Agriculture, Community Affairs, Finance and Tax, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 212 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Banking and Insurance, Criminal Justice and Senator Oelrich—

Claims/Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers; Provides for interpretation of provisions relating to workers' compensation benefits for certain services performed by off-duty deputy sheriffs. Provides conditions under which a law enforcement officer, correctional officer, or correctional probation officer who suffers from a specified medical condition and has materially departed from the prescribed treatment for that condition shall lose a specified presumption for workers' compensation claims, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 26, 2010

SB 340 (3R) by Senator Wilson and others—

Sealing and Expunging Criminal History Records; Cites this act as the "Jim King Keep Florida Working Act." Authorizes a court to expunge a criminal history record of a person who had a prior criminal history record sealed or expunged in certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

CS/SB 448 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Detert and others—

Wireless Communications Device/Driving; Creates the "Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law." Prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle while using a wireless communications device for certain purposes. Provides for points to be assessed against a driver's license for the unlawful use of a wireless communications device resulting in a crash, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/SB 482 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Regulation and Senator Bennett—

Highway Safety Act; Provides legislative intent relating to road rage and aggressive careless driving. Defines the term "road rage." Requires an operator of a motor vehicle to yield the left lane when being overtaken on a multilane highway. Revises the types of documentation that a secondary metals recycler must obtain, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time, amended, and read the third time on April 26, 2010

HB 11 (3R) by Representatives Porth, Rogers and others—

Crimes Against Homeless Persons; Reclassifies offenses evidencing prejudice based on homeless status of victim. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for SB 506 (SUB) (Ring) and read the second time on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/SB 690 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Dean and others—

Local Government Accountability; Clarifies when the DCA may institute procedures for declaring that a special district is inactive. Specifies the level of detail required for each fund in the sheriff's proposed budget. Amends specified provision relating to the review of the actuarial reports and statements of retirement plans of governmental entities by the DMS. Deletes a time restriction on preparing and presenting a tentative county budget, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

CS/HB 1551 (3R) by the Committee on Economic Development Policy (EDCA) and Representative Carroll—

Black Business Investment Board, Inc.; Deletes description of BBIB as public-private entity; requires BBIB to assist OTTED in creating long-range strategic policy for Black Business Loan Program; revises entities with whom BBIB may create partnerships; revises membership of board of directors; provides for certain members to be ex officio, nonvoting members; revises requirements for selection, removal, & terms of chair & vice chair, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/SB 1720 (SUB) (Smith) and read the second time on April 26, 2010

HB 7037 (3R) by the Education Policy Council, Representative Coley and others—

Education; Revises & repeals provisions relating to vocational rehabilitation programs & services; revises provisions relating to eligibility for services; provides duties of Division of Vocational Rehabilitation in DOE; allows records to be released for audit, program evaluation, & research purposes; repeals provisions relating to SMART Schools Clearinghouse; specifies criteria for prioritization of SIT Program awards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1806 (SUB) (Detert) and read the second time on April 26, 2010

CS/HB 889 (3R) by the Health & Family Services Policy Council, Representative Adkins and others—

Biomedical Research; Repeals Center for Health Technologies, FL Biomedical & Social Research Act, Cervical Cancer Elimination Task Force, & FL Cancer Council; revises provisions relating to FL Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease; revises advisory council membership; transfers & revises provisions relating to FL Cancer Council mission & duties to include them within William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., & David Coley Cancer Research Program. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 2100 (SUB) (Wise) and read the second time on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/HB 325 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Reagan and others—

Uniform Traffic Control; Preempts to state use of cameras to enforce traffic laws; authorizes counties & municipalities to use traffic infraction detectors under certain circumstances; creates Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Program; authorizes DHSMV, county, or municipality to use traffic infraction detector to identify motor vehicle that fails to stop at traffic control signal steady red light, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 2166 (SUB) (Altman) and read the second time on April 26, 2010

**CS/SB 2448 (3R) by the Committee on
Community Affairs and Senator Bennett—**

Vehicle Operation; Redefines the term "electric personal assistive mobility device" to include additional devices for transporting one person. Authorizes local governments to regulate certain vehicles and other motorized devices operating on sidewalks. Exempts motorized wheelchairs from certain ordinances. Authorizes local governments to enact ordinances permitting the use of golf carts on sidewalks, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 26, 2010

**CS/SB 2584 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal
Justice and Senator Altman—**

Handbill Distribution; Provides additional penalties for the offense of unlawfully distributing handbills in a public lodging establishment. Specifies that certain items used in committing such offense are subject to seizure and forfeiture under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 26, 2010

**CS/SB 1126 (3R) by the Committee on
Environmental Preservation and Conservation
and Senator Altman—**

Permitting; Provides requirements for claiming certain site rehabilitation costs in applications for contaminated site rehabilitation tax credits. Clarifies duties of the OTTED to approve expedited permitting and comprehensive plan amendments. Revises criteria for businesses submitting permit applications or local comprehensive plan amendments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

**CS/CS/SB 1952 (3R) by the Committees on
General Government Appropriations,
Environmental Preservation and Conservation
and Senator Detert—**

Water Management Districts; Authorizes water management districts to use certain moneys in the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund for water resource development projects. Revises provisions relating to the membership of basin boards. Exempts cooperative funding programs from certain rulemaking requirements. Revises legislative intent relating to landscape irrigation restrictions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

SB 2252 (SO) by Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates the authority of members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires that persons addressing a legislative committee take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Provides criminal penalties for certain false statements before a legislative committee. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance card in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 2434 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health Regulation and Senator Gardiner—

Health Care; Amends a provision relating to the Drug-Free Workplace Act. Deletes an obsolete provision. Revises distribution of funds from civil penalties imposed for traffic infractions by county courts. Limits DOH food service inspections in nursing homes. Requires that certain blood establishments disclose specified information on the Internet. Revises grievance record maintenance and reporting requirements for nursing homes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

*Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 1143 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means*

CS/SB 220 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Fasano—

Tax On Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Deletes a requirement that a specified penalty is mandatory and may not be waived by the DOR. Deletes authorization to return certain aircraft to the state for repairs without liability for taxes and penalties under certain circumstances. Exempts from the use tax aircraft that are owned by nonresidents and that enter and remain in the state for certain purposes under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

*Similar to **CS/HB 173 (HC)** in Messages*

SB 838 (SO) by Senator Fasano and others—

University of South Florida/Doctor of Pharmacy; Authorizes a doctor of pharmacy degree program at the university. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Higher Education and Health Regulation and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1604 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Smith—

Violation of Traffic Laws/Penalties; Provides for a person charged with a noncriminal traffic infraction to make periodic payments when paying civil penalties and fees. Provides for suspension of a driver's license for failure to enter into or comply with the terms of a penalty payment plan. Provides for the removal of the designation as a habitual traffic offender upon proof of compliance with certain statutory provisions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committees on Community Affairs and Judiciary report the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 2138 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Gardiner—

Health Care; Repeals a provision relating to a prohibition against applying the Drug-Free Workplace Act retroactively. Repeals a provision relating to the investigation of complaints regarding hospitals. Provides requirements for an alternative administrator of a home health agency. Transfers administrative responsibility for the application procedure for federally qualified health centers from the DOH to the ACHA, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/CS/SB 2400 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Transportation and Senator Gardiner—

Motor Vehicles; Authorizes crash reports to be provided to law enforcement agencies and county traffic operations. Provides that certain tri-vehicles are hybrid vehicles. Revises qualifications for an immobilization agency to immobilize vehicles in a judicial circuit. Requires a lienholder who repossesses a motor vehicle in this state to apply for a certificate of repossession or certificate of title, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 971 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Criminal Justice, Finance and Tax, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations*

CS/SB 514 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Tax, Senator Fasano and others—

Sales Tax Exemption/Clothing/School Supplies; Specifies a period during which the sale of clothing and school supplies are exempt from the tax on sales, use, and other transactions. Provides definitions and exceptions. Authorizes the Department of Revenue to adopt emergency rules. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

*Compare to **CS/HB 483 & HB 469 (HC)** in the Committee on Finance and Tax*

CS/CS/SB 262 (SO) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Bennett and others—

Affordable Housing; Revises definitions relating to agency inspectors general to include the Florida Housing Finance Corporation. Provides a housing finance authority with an additional purpose for which it may exercise its power to borrow. Revises the allocation of certain proceeds distributed from the excise tax on documents which are paid into the State Treasury to the credit of the State Housing Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

*Compare to **CS/CS/CS/HB 665 (HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs and Finance and Tax*

CS/CS/SB 1234 (SO) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Garcia—

Child Care Facilities/Licensing Standards; Cites this act as the "John F. Serrano, Rachel Lou Napier, and Alexandra Ali Safety and Accountability Act." Provides minimum licensing requirements for window blinds and other window coverings. Requires child care facilities to retrofit window blinds, window coverings, pull cords, or inner cords by a specified date in order to eliminate cords that pose a risk of strangulation. Authorizes the DCFS to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1776 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Commerce and Senator Altman—

Space and Aerospace Infrastructure; Revises authorized uses of specified Space Florida appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 194 (SO) by Senator Joyner—

Injunctions for Protection/Violations; Adds circumstances that violate an injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Judiciary, and Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 346 (SO) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Dean and others—


