BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 2262 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Thrasher—

Charter Schools; Revises requirements for providing financial statements to the sponsor of a charter school. Authorizes a governing body to oversee multiple charter schools. Provides requirements for designation as a high-performing charter school. Authorizes such a charter school to increase enrollment and receive capital outlay funds. Provides for the establishment of charter virtual schools, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 22, 2010

SB 1258 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture (Dean)—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requires that the department and representatives of the state pest control industry prepare a report for the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of specified legislative committees by a certain date. Requires that the report include recommendations for changes in the law to provide for disciplinary action against licensees of pest control industry under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 23, 2010

CS/SB 1918 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Aronberg—

Traffic Offenses; Provides penalties for the commission of a noncriminal traffic infraction or certain other violations that cause or result in the serious injury of a motorcyclist, bicyclist, pedestrian, or person of other means of conveyance. Provides enhanced penalties for such violations that cause the death of such person. Provides that the act does not prohibit the person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010; read the third time on April 26, 2010; and with pending amendment #3 (barcode 626924) by Senator Oelrich on April 27, 2010

CS/CS/HB 131 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Adams and others—

Absent Uniformed Services and Overseas Voters; Defines "absent uniformed services voter" & revises definition of "overseas voter"; requires supervisor of elections to notify absent uniformed services voter & overseas voter of free access system for determining absentee ballot status; provides timeframe for absentee ballot to be sent to each absent uniformed services voter & overseas voter, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 900 (SUB) (Thrasher), read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

CS/CS/SB 570 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Constantine and others—

Environmental Protection; Revises the greenhouse gas reporting requirement for major emitters. Requires all public entities and those entities occupying buildings managed by the DMS to report recycling data to the county using the format designated by the DEP. Provides for the creation of a voluntary recyclers certification program. Revises requirements for review of new waste-to-energy facility capacity by the DEP, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010; and further amended on April 26, 2010

*Compare to **HB 7243 (HC)** in the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Community Affairs, and General Government Appropriations*

CS/SB 1126 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Altman—

Permitting; Provides requirements for claiming certain site rehabilitation costs in applications for contaminated site rehabilitation tax credits. Clarifies duties of the OTTED to approve expedited permitting and comprehensive plan amendments. Revises criteria for businesses submitting permit applications or local comprehensive plan amendments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

SB 2252 (3R) by Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates the authority of members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires that persons addressing a legislative committee take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Provides criminal penalties for certain false statements before a legislative committee. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance card in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2010

CS/HB 795 (3R) by the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Jones and others—

Penalties for Violation of Traffic Laws; Provides for person charged with noncriminal traffic infraction to make periodic payments to pay civil penalties & fees; provides for certain persons cited for specified offenses to provide proof of compliance to designated official; provides alternative citation disposition procedures for certain offenses; provides for removal of habitual traffic offender designation upon proof of compliance by certain offenders. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1604 (SUB)** (Smith) and read the second time on April 27, 2010*

CS/CS/HB 971 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA) and Representative Aubuchon—

Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles; Defines term "tri-vehicle" for purposes of Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law; requires that drivers of certain commercial motor vehicles slow before crossing railroad grade crossing; requires bicycles to be ridden in lane marked for bicycle use except under specified circumstances; creates Hispanic Achievers license plate, Children First license plate, & Veterans of Foreign Wars license plate, etc. Effective Date: 09/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 2400 (SUB)** (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 27, 2010*

CS/HB's 483, 469 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, Representatives Rivera, Flores and others—

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; (THIS BILL COMBINES H483 & H469) Specifies period during which sale of books, clothing, & school supplies is exempt from tax. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 514 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 27, 2010*

CS/CS/CS/HB 665 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Full Appropriations Council on Education & Economic Development, the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Aubuchon and others—

Affordable Housing; Provides housing finance authority with additional purpose for which it may exercise power to borrow; revises provisions relating to local comprehensive plans to authorize inclusion of element for affordable housing for certain seniors; provides for disposition of real property by local government for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 262 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 27, 2010*

CS/CS/SB 1234 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Garcia—

Child Care Facilities/Licensing Standards; Cites this act as the "John F. Serrano, Rachel Lou Napier, and Alexandra Ali Safety and Accountability Act." Provides minimum licensing requirements for window blinds and other window coverings. Provides for certain household children to be included in calculations regarding the capacity of licensed family day care homes and large family child care homes. Revises advertising requirements applicable to child care facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2010

CS/HB 969 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations (CEED), Representative Crisafulli and others—

Space and Aerospace Infrastructure; Revises authorized uses of specified Space Florida appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1776 (SUB) (Altman) and read the second time on April 27, 2010

SB 194 (3R) by Senator Joyner and others—

Injunctions for Protection/Violations; Adds circumstances that violate an injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/CS/SB 346 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Dean and others—

Working Waterfront Property; Specifies properties that are eligible for classification as working waterfront property. Requires property appraisers to consider specified factors in assessing certain property. Provides for assessment of a portion of property within a working waterfront property which is not used as such property. Requires an application for classification of property as working waterfront property, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/CS/CS/SB 354 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Community Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Dean—

Mobile Home and Recreational Vehicle Parks; Specifies laws and rules to be enforced by the Department of Health. Provides for the adoption of rules. Revises applicability of recreational vehicle park requirements to mobile home parks. Revises permit requirements. Provides requirements for construction review and approval for private parks and camps. Revises requirements for permit applications. Revises fees charged to operators of certain parks or camps, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/CS/HB 435 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council, the Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources Policy (GGPC), Representatives Abruzzo and Grady—

Marketable Record Title; Revises exceptions to marketability by including any right, title, or interest held by Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund, any water management district, or United States; conforms provisions to changes made by act; provides requirements for recorded notice to preserve claim of right. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 518 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/SB 796 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Hill and others—

Injunctions for Protection; Subject to available funding, directs the Florida Association of Court Clerks to develop an automated process by which a petitioner may request notification of service of the injunction for protection. Requires that notice to the petitioner be given to the petitioner within a specified time. Provides for the content of the notice. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/HB 569 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources Policy (GGPC) and Representative Poppel—

Landfills; Authorizes disposal of yard trash at specified Class I landfills; requires such landfills to obtain modified operating permit; requires permittees to certify certain collection & beneficial use of landfill gas; provides applicability. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1052 (SUB) (Gaetz), read the second time and amended on April 27, 2010

CS/HB 551 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Eisnagle—

Pub. Rec. & Meetings/County/Complaints on Conduct; Revises exemption from public record & public meeting requirements for complaints & related records in custody of & proceedings conducted by county or municipality with established local investigatory process to enforce more stringent standards of conduct & disclosure requirements; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions under Open Government Sunset Review Act; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1054 (SUB) (Altman) and read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/HB 1157 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, Representative Eisnagle and others—

Local Government Prompt Payment Act; Revises definitions; revises provisions relating to timely payment for purchases of construction services; requires that dispute be resolved according to procedures in contract; prohibits assessment of damages against contractor if list of items remaining to complete is not timely provided to contractor; revises provisions relating to resolution of disputes concerning improper payment request or invoice, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1056 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 27, 2010

CS/CS/CS/HB 1143 (3R) by the Health & Family Services Policy Council, the Committees on Health Care Appropriations (CGHC), Health Care Regulation Policy (HFPC), Representative Hudson and others—

Health Care; Amends provision relating to Drug-Free Workplace Act; revises distribution of funds from civil penalties imposed for traffic violations by county courts; directs the DOH to accept funds from counties, municipalities, & certain other entities for purchase of certain products made available under contract with U.S. Department of Health & Human Services for manufacture & delivery of such products in response to public health emergency, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 2434 (SUB) (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 27, 2010; and amended on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 1035 (3R) by the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC) and Representative Frishe—

Elevator Safety; Requires DBPR's Division of Hotels & Restaurants to adopt rules; authorizes division to enter certain buildings; provides for variances; exempts certain elevators from specific code update requirements; provides phase-in period for such elevators; specifies additional acts by registered elevator company or certificateholder which are subject to discipline, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1172 (SUB) (Bennett) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

HB 7019 (3R) by the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Workman and others—

Mortgage Guaranty Trust Fund Creation/OFR; Creates Mortgage Guaranty Trust Fund within OFR of DFS; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for SB 1228 (SUB) (Fasano) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/SB 1408 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and the Committee on Finance and Tax (Altman)—

Working Waterfront Property; Specifies properties that are eligible for classification as working waterfront property. Requires property appraisers to consider specified factors in assessing certain property. Provides new program objectives for the Stan Mayfield Working Waterfronts Program and the Florida Forever Program which are to be considered in selecting projects, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/HB 1237 (3R) by the Criminal & Civil Justice Policy Council, the Committee on Civil Justice & Courts Policy (CCJP) and Representative Hukill—

Probate Procedures; Imposes additional duties on lessor of safe-deposit box; authorizes lessor to charge fees for performing such duties; revises requirements relating to filing caveat; revises provisions relating to notice; revises provision relating to right of election; provides that decedent's spouse may elect to take interest in homestead as tenant in common rather than life estate; provides that such election is irrevocable, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1544 (SUB) (Joyner) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 843 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, Representative Boyd and others—

Rural Enterprise Zones; Requires OTTED to designate specified rural catalyst sites as rural enterprise zones upon host county request; specifies request requirements; specifies effect of designation; specifies reporting requirements for rural catalyst sites designated as rural enterprise zone; authorizes host county development authorities to enter into memoranda of agreement for specified purposes. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1724 (SUB) (Dean) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 1455 (3R) by the Committee on Public Safety & Domestic Security Policy (CCJP), Representative Sachs and others—

Misrepresentation of Military Status; Prohibits person from falsely representing himself or herself as member of or representing U.S. Armed Forces or National Guard for purpose of solicitation of charitable contributions or participation in charitable or sponsor sales promotion; prohibits person from wearing uniform of or any medal or insignia authorized for use by members or veterans of U.S. Armed Forces or National Guard, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 1824 (SUB) (Gelber) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/HB 1565 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representatives Dorworth, Ford, Gaetz and others—

Rulemaking; Requires each agency, before adopting, amending, or repealing certain rules, to prepare statement of estimated regulatory costs of proposed rule if proposed rule has adverse impacts on small business or increases regulatory costs; provides exception to circumstances under which emergency rule shall not be effective, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1844 (SUB) (Bennett) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/CS/HB 963 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Full Appropriations Council on Education & Economic Development, the Committee on Economic Development Policy (EDCA), Representative Ray and others—

Seaports; Provides for application & issuance of port conceptual permits; provides requirements & procedures relating to such permits for DEP & Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund; revises matching-fund requirements for projects to rehabilitate certain structures; requires DOT to include certain projects & funding allocations in legislative budget requests; provides for transfer of budget between certain projects, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 2000 (SUB) (Ring) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/HB 723 (3R) by the Education Policy Council, the Committee on State Universities & Private Colleges Policy (EPC), Representative Sachs and others—

Postsecondary Education; Authorizes state universities & community colleges to waive tuition & fees for certain public school classroom teachers for undergraduate courses approved by DOE; Requires State Board of Education rulemaking; prohibits cause of action against state university for actions or decisions of state university student government, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 2102 (SUB) (Wise) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/HB's 1073, 81 (3R) by the Full Appropriations Council on Education & Economic Development, the Committee on PreK-12 Policy (EPC), Representatives Llorente, Hukill and others—

Persons with Disabilities; (THIS BILL COMBINES H1073 & H81) Revises provisions relating to licensure & standards for facilities & programs for persons with developmental disabilities; requires minimum training for child care personnel to include identification & care of children with developmental disabilities; provides requirements for use of seclusion & restraint on public school students with disabilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 2118 (SUB) (Gardiner), read the second time and amended on April 28, 2010

CS/SB 2140 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Joyner and others—

Administrative Procedures; Requires an agency's notice of rule development to indicate whether the rule may have an adverse impact on small businesses. Requires that the agency also notify the Small Business Regulatory Advisory Council if the rule may have an adverse impact. Revises provisions relating to an agency's response to a proposal by a substantially affected person for a lower cost regulatory alternative to a proposed rule, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2010

HB 7085 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative K. Roberson—

OGSR/Commission on Ethics; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for complaints & related records held by Commission on Ethics or Commission on Ethics and Public Trust established by county or municipality & exemption from public meetings requirements for proceedings conducted by such commissions pursuant to complaint or preliminary investigation; reorganizes exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 2170 (SUB) (Alexander) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 1145 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources Policy (GGPC), Representative Bemby and others—

State Parks; Provides discounts on annual passes for members & veterans of U.S. Armed Forces & reserve forces & for surviving spouses of certain veterans; provides additional duties of Division of Recreation & Parks of DEP. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 2256 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

HJR 7231 (3R) by the Committee on Select Policy Council on Strategic and Economic Planning and Representative Hukill—

Legislative and Congressional District Boundaries; Proposes creation of s. 20, Art. III of State Constitution to provide standards for establishing legislative & congressional district boundaries.

Substituted for CS/CS/SJR 2288 (SUB) (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 7179 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Energy & Utilities Policy (GGPC), Representative Precourt and others—

Qualifying Improvements to Real Property; Authorizes local government to levy non-ad valorem assessments to fund specified improvements to real property; authorizes property owners to enter into financing agreement with local government to finance specified improvements; authorizes local government to collect moneys for improvement purposes through non-ad valorem assessments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/SB 2322 (SUB) (Bennett) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

HB 7035 (3R) by the Criminal & Civil Justice Policy Council, Representative Holder and others—

Criminal Justice; Repeals provision relating to prohibition on Attorney General collecting fee for defending supposed offender; repeals provisions relating to sheriff's or deputy's required place of residence; removes penalty provisions relating to criminal transmission of HIV; revises provisions relating to obsolete community residential drug punishment centers; repeals provisions relating to initiation of restoration of civil rights, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/SB 2350 (SUB) (Dockery) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/CS/CS/HB 1271 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committees on Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations (CEED), Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Horner and others—

Transportation; Authorizes counties within or under interlocal agreement with regional transportation or transit authority to levy discretionary sales surtax for transportation systems under certain conditions; provides that county commission may apply proceeds from charter county transportation system surtax to planning, development, construction, expansion, operation, & maintenance of on-demand transportation services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/SB 2362 (SUB) (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 28, 2010


