SB 140 School Food Service Programs by Senator Siplin

Recognizes that school children need nutritious food not only for healthy physical and intellectual development but also to combat diseases related to poor nutrition and obesity. Establishes the Florida Farm Fresh Schools Program within the Department of Education (DOE).

Requires the DOE to work with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (DOACS) to recommend policies and rules to the State Board of Education pertaining to school food services. Provides criteria for such policies and rules which include, but are not limited to, requiring school districts and schools to buy fresh and high-quality foods grown in this state when feasible and encouraging school districts and schools to demonstrate a preference for competitively priced organic food products.

Requires the DOE, in collaboration with the DOACS, to provide outreach, guidance, and training to districts, schools, school food service directors, parent and teacher organizations, and students about the benefits of fresh food products from farms in this state.

Requires the program to maintain compliance with the rules and regulations of the National School Lunch Program. (See bill for details)
