SB 1262

School-entry Requirements/Vision Examinations
by Senator Wilson

Requires children who are entering public or private schools to present a certification of a school-entry comprehensive vision examination performed within 1 year prior to their enrollment in school. Allows each district school board and the governing authority of each private school to establish a policy that permits a student up to 120 school days to present the certification.

Imposes a 25-cent fee on the retail sale of nonprescription eyeglasses to be distributed by the Department of Health for the purpose of assisting parents in need of financial assistance to pay for the vision exam. (See bill for details)
