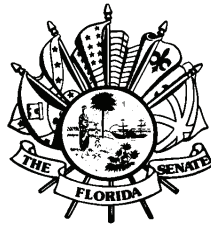

BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, MARCH 31, 2010

SB 2700 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means (Alexander)—

Appropriations; Provides moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, to pay salaries, and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

SB 2702 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means (Alexander)—

Implementing 2010-2011 General Appropriations Act; Provides legislative intent. Delays the expiration of provisions providing for the Legislative Budget Commission to review and approve recommendations by the Governor for fixed capital outlay projects funded by grants awarded from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Amends a specified provision relating to the state group insurance program. Provides that the annual salary of the members of the Legislature be reduced by 7 percent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 1510 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

Department of Citrus; Revises the location of the executive offices of the Department of Citrus. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Means, reports the committee substitute favorably*

CS/SB 1508 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Removes the Division of Dairy Industry within the department. Adds the inspection of dairy farms, milk plants, and milk product plants and other specified functions to the duties of the Division of Food Safety within the department. Provides for the Market Improvements Working Capital Trust Fund within the DOACS to be the depository for funds collected by agricultural marketing facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Means, reports the committee substitute favorably*

CS/SB 1514 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations, Senator Baker and others—

Recreational Licenses; Exempts the shoreline fishing license from a charge imposed to compensate the subagent or tax collector issuing the license. Authorizes the subagent or tax collector to retain a portion of certain other license proceeds. Removes the fee for an annual resident shoreline fishing license. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Means, reports the committee substitute favorably*

CS/CS/SB 1516 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

State-owned Lands; Requires the property appraiser to physically inspect any parcel of taxable or state-owned real property upon the request of the taxpayer or owner. Removes provisions requiring the DOR to notify property appraisers of state ownership of real property. Authorizes the DOR to disclose certain information to the DEP regarding state-owned lands, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1592 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

Fiscally Constrained Counties; Provides for the determination by a fiscally constrained county of the reduction in ad valorem revenues resulting from the implementation of a provision of the State Constitution. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1466 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health and Human Services Appropriations and Senator Peadar—

Child Welfare/Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Limits state agency contract monitoring to once every 3 years if the contracted provider is subject to accreditation surveys by specified accreditation organizations. Allows the establishment of an Internet-based data warehouse to maintain the records of contract providers. Creates a family needs assistance referral pilot program. Provides funding requirements for contracts for foster care and related services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1468 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health and Human Services Appropriations and Senator Peadar—

Home and Community-based Services; Reduces the annual maximum expenditure to each client assigned by the APD to tier one, tier two, tier three, and tier four level services. Eliminates behavior assistant services in certain group homes as deliverable service to eligible clients. Establishes the iBudget program for the delivery of home and community based services. Provides for amendment of current contracts to implement the iBudget system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1484 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health and Human Services Appropriations and Senator Peadar—

Medicaid; Authorizes the ACHA to contract with an entity for the provision of comprehensive behavioral health care services to certain Medicaid recipients who are not enrolled in a Medicaid managed care plan or a Medicaid provider service network under certain circumstances. Extends by 3 years the statewide implementation of an enhanced service delivery system for the Florida Medicaid program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1464 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health and Human Services Appropriations and Senator Peadar—

Agency for Health Care Administration; Increases the assessments imposed on hospital inpatient and outpatient services and deposited into the Public Medical Assistance Trust Fund. Provides flexibility for nursing home facilities with respect to meeting minimum staffing requirements. Requires community-based providers to assist in the transition of enrollees and cease provision of certain waiver services by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1396 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations and Senator Crist—

Incentive Gain-time; Prohibits an inmate from receiving incentive gain-time credits for completing the requirements for and receiving a general educational development certificate or vocational certificate if the inmate was convicted of a specified offense on or after a specified date. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1400 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations and Senator Crist—

State Judicial System; Requires that \$50 from the Supreme Court filing fee be deposited into the State Courts Revenue TF. Renames the Operating Trust Fund in the state courts system as the "Administrative Trust Fund." Directs that fees from the foreign language court interpreters program be deposited into the Administrative Trust Fund within the state courts system. Increases the portion of certain filing fees to be deposited into the General Revenue Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1368 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations and Senator Wise—

Public School Funding; Deletes a requirement that school boards imposing the school capital outlay surtax freeze noncapital local school property taxes for at least 3 years. Extends the duration of a provision specifying methods to calculate the salary of a school board member. Removes the repeal of provisions authorizing a reduction in the incentive grants that are awarded to consortium service organizations, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments

CS/SB 1344 (SO) by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations and Senator Lynn—

Higher Education; Revises provisions relating to the use of funds for providing educational opportunities and benefits to dependent children or spouses of deceased or disabled veterans. Revises the powers and duties of university boards of trustees relating to a university's contracting authority. Revises provisions relating to workforce education postsecondary student fees. Provides a limitation on the compensation paid to community college presidents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1436 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Fasano and others—

Vehicle Registration Fees; Revises the service charge for each application that is handled in connection with the original issuance, duplicate issuance, or transfer of any license plate, mobile home sticker, or validation sticker or with the transfer or duplicate issuance of a registration certificate. Deletes a provision requiring that a portion of the charge be deposited into the General Revenue Fund, etc. Effective Date: 09/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1438 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

Highway Safety; Removes provisions requiring the driver of a vehicle that is involved in a crash resulting in bodily injury to or the death of any person or damage to any vehicle or other property to forward a written report of the crash to the HSMV within a specified time. Requires the HSMV to authorize any or all tax collectors in the state to serve as agents for the department by providing certain specified driver's license services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1442 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

Corporate License Plates; Authorizes the HSMV to create the Corporate License Plate Program and enter into certain agreements with certain entities. Authorizes vehicle owners to apply for such license plates. Requires that specified minimum fees be paid by applicants and corporate sponsors for such applications. Authorizes corporate sponsors to participate in the program by submitting a specified minimum initial application fee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1444 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

Supplemental Corporate Fees; Deletes an exception from the application of a late charge for a business entity that does not receive the uniform business report prescribed by the Department of State. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1646 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Fasano and others—

Regional Workforce Boards; Prohibits board members and their relatives from contracting with or having a financial interest in a contract with the regional workforce board on which the member serves. Requires a member who is employed by or who receives remuneration from a contracting entity to abstain from voting on a contract with that entity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 2374 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

State Group Insurance Program; Establishes the state's monthly contributions for employees who have individual coverage and for employees who have family coverage. Requires that the Division of State Group Insurance within the DMS establish a state employee health clinic pilot program. Requires the Division of State Group Insurance to contract for postpayment claims review services for the State Group Insurance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1238 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Ring—

Review/DMS/Florida Government Accountability Act; Transfers certain programs and related trust funds from the Department of Management Services to other state agencies within the executive branch. Authorizes the Executive Office of the Governor to transfer funds and positions with the approval of the Legislative Budget Commission. Requests the interim assistance of the Division of Statutory Revision to prepare conforming legislation for the next regular session of the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2384 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

State Employees/Collective Bargaining; Provides for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the State of Florida and certified bargaining units of state employees. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2020 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

Information Technology; Revises the duties and responsibilities of the Agency for Enterprise Information Technology. Requires said agency to make annual recommendations to the Legislature regarding the migration to a statewide e-mail service and the consolidation of purchasing certain commodities and services. Revises provisions relating to statewide e-mail services. Revises provisions relating to the SUNCOM Network, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2022 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

Florida Retirement System; Deletes a provision ensuring certain rights of members of the system. Provides for employee and employer contributions. Provides that the rights of members are of a contractual nature. Requires employee and employer contributions to the retirement system effective January 1, 2011. Limits the payment of benefits prior to a participant's termination of employment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2024 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

Tax on Communications and Utility Services; Decreases the rate at which the sales price of certain communications services are taxed. Requires that the State Board of Education make specified adjustments to the figures used by the board in determining the amount of bond debt that can be serviced by revenues derived from the gross receipts tax on utility services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2386 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

State Financial Matters; Authorizes the CFO to adopt rules requiring that payments made by the state for goods, services, or anything of value be made by electronic means. Requires that the rules include methods for accommodating persons who may not be able to receive payment by electronic means. Requires that the CFO adopt and disseminate uniform minimum procedures to state agencies for agreements that provide state or federal financial assistance to a recipient, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

SR 2770 (SR) by Senator Villalobos—

Honorable Emiliano Jose "E.J." Salcines, Jr.; Honors the Honorable Emiliano Jose "E.J." Salcines, Jr., for his lifetime commitment to public service, education, and the administration of justice.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 708 (2R) by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Senator Baker and others—

Disposition of Human Remains; Revises the term "legally authorized person" for purposes of the Florida Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services Act. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security

CS/SB 844 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Bennett and others—

Insurance; Expands the definition of "affiliated party" to include certain third-party marketers. Includes family members of insurance agents in a prohibition related to the transaction of life insurance. Prohibits the Department of Financial Services from issuing certain licenses in certain circumstances. Increases the administrative fine that may be imposed for each willful violation of the offenses of twisting and churning, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, ENVIRONMENT, AND LAND USE [EPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 50 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Rich—

Relief/Madonna Castillo/City of Hialeah; Provides for an appropriation to compensate her for injuries and damages that she sustained as a result of the negligence of the City of Hialeah. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 610 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Fasano and others—

Collective Bargaining for Certain Public Employees; Specifies that for purposes of resolving an impasse the sheriff, the tax collector, the property appraiser, the supervisor of elections, and the clerk of the circuit court are each deemed the "legislative body" for their respective employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/SB 1118 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Altman and others—

Docks; Authorizes the placement of roofs on certain residential single-family docks. Authorizes the DEP to adopt rules that include special criteria for approving certain docking facilities in shellfish harvesting waters. Authorizes the department to maintain a list of projects or activities for applicants to consider when developing proposals in order to meet mitigation or public interest requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 1882 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Gaetz—

State Park Designations/Bob Graham/Jack Mashburn; Designates the Bob Graham Grayton Beach State Park in Walton County. Designates the Jack Mashburn Marina within St. Andrew's State Park. Directs the Department of Environmental Protection to erect appropriate signs and markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS [GPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 464 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Fasano and others—

Veterans' Suicide Prevention; Directs the FDVA, in partnership with the Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention and the DCFS, to seek federal funding for a grants program that addresses veterans' outreach and suicide prevention. Revises the membership of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council to include a representative of the Florida Psychological Association and veterans appointed by the Governor, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Provides that the rights of members are of a contractual nature. Requires employee and employer contributions to the retirement system effective January 1, 2011. Limits the payment of benefits prior to a participant's termination of employment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 2024 (2R) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

Tax on Communications and Utility Services; Decreases the rate at which the sales price of certain communications services are taxed. Requires that the State Board of Education make specified adjustments to the figures used by the board in determining the amount of bond debt that can be serviced by revenues derived from the gross receipts tax on utility services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 2386 (2R) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

State Financial Matters; Authorizes the CFO to adopt rules requiring that payments made by the state for goods, services, or anything of value be made by electronic means. Requires that the rules include methods for accommodating persons who may not be able to receive payment by electronic means. Requires that the CFO adopt and disseminate uniform minimum procedures to state agencies for agreements that provide state or federal financial assistance to a recipient, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

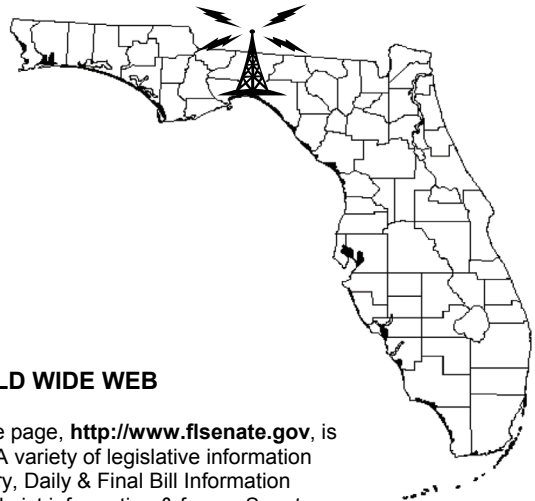
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
