CS/SB 622 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—

Gaming; Amends specified provision relating to compact authorization. Provides that specified agreements executed by the Seminole Tribe of Florida and the Governor are void and not in effect. Ratifies and approves a specified compact executed by the Tribe and the Governor. Directs the Governor to cooperate with the Tribe in seeking approval of the compact from the United States Secretary of the Interior, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/SB 8 (SO) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance and Senator Negron—

Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud; Establishes the Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud Strike Force within the Department of Financial Services to coordinate efforts to eliminate Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to prepare model interagency agreements that address Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Establishes the Division of Public Assistance Fraud within the Department of Financial Services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 844 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Bennett and others—

Insurance; Expands the definition of "affiliated party" to include certain third-party marketers. Includes family members of insurance agents in a prohibition related to the transaction of life insurance. Prohibits the Department of Financial Services from issuing certain licenses in certain circumstances. Increases the administrative fine that may be imposed for each willful violation of the offenses of twisting and churning, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Community Associations; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1196 & S1222) Exempts certain elevators from specific code update requirements. Revises the limitations on the right of members to vote on corporate matters for certain corporations not for profit that are regulated under specified provisions. Specifies the maximum amount of any unit owner's loss assessment coverage that can be assessed for any loss. Creates the "Distressed Condominium Relief Act", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

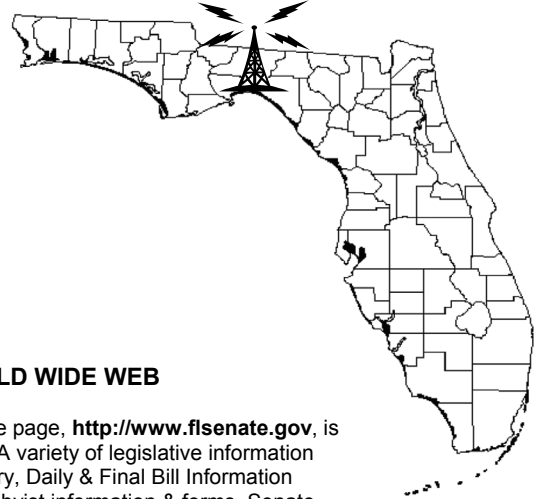
