CS/CS/SB 8 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance, Senator Negron and others—

Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud; Establishes the Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud Strike Force within the Department of Financial Services to coordinate efforts to eliminate Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to prepare model interagency agreements that address Medicaid and public assistance fraud. Establishes the Division of Public Assistance Fraud within the Department of Financial Services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 15, 2010

CS/CS/SB 366 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Regulated Industries and Senator Wise—

Retail Sales of Smoking Pipes and Devices; Prohibits retail sales of certain smoking pipes and smoking devices under certain circumstances. Specifies criteria for the lawful sales of such items. Provides a criminal penalty for unlawful sales of such items. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 15, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS [GPSC] GROUPING

SB 618 (3R) by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security (Aronberg)—

OGSR/Domestic Security Oversight Council; Repeals a specified provision relating to an exemption from the public records and public meetings requirements for those portions of meetings of the Domestic Security Oversight Council, including records thereof, at which active criminal investigative or intelligence information is discussed. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act. Deletes provisions providing for repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 15, 2010

Identical to **HB 7093 (HC)** in the Committees on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

SB 1424 (3R) by Senator Garcia and others—

Epidemiological Monitoring Systems; authorizes the Department of Health to collaborate with and disclose certain information to the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for specified purposes. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 15, 2010

SB 882 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Storms)—

OGSR/Address Confidentiality/Domestic Violence; Repeals a specified provision relating to an exemption from public records requirements for information in the Address Confidentiality Program for Victims of Domestic Violence under s. 741.465, F.S. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act. Deletes provisions providing for repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 15, 2010

Identical to **HB 7123 (HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Similar to **HB 7079 (HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 316 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Transportation and Senator Altman—

Child-restraint Requirements/Motor Vehicles; Provides child-restraint requirements for certain children ages 4 through 7. Provides certain exceptions. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements. Provides a grace period. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 704 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Thrasher and others—

Capital Felonies; Provides that it is an aggravating circumstance for the purpose of determining sentence if a capital felony was committed by a person subject to an injunction or protection order against the petitioner who obtained that injunction or order or any of certain related persons. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

SB 1006 (3R) by Senator Jones—

Department of Juvenile Justice/Reports/Functions; Deletes a provision that requires the DJJ to develop an annual report on the performance of assessment and treatment services for serious or habitual juvenile offenders for delivery to the Governor and other designated persons by a specified date. Repeals a specified provision relating to the requirement that the DJJ and the DOE develop and implement an evaluation of the literacy programs for juvenile offenders, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/CS/SB 1058 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12, Criminal Justice and Senator Aronberg—

Cooperation Between Schools & Juvenile Authorities;

Requires that specified school personnel be notified when a child of any age is formally charged by a state attorney with a felony or a delinquent act that would be a felony if committed by an adult and the disposition of the charges. Authorizes certain entities to release a student's education records without consent of the student or parent to parties to an interagency agreement for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2010

CS/HB 105 (3R) by the Committee on PreK-12 Policy (EPC), Representatives McBurney, Hudson, Kelly and others—

Civics Education; Designates act "Justice Sandra Day O'Connor Civics Education Act"; provides requirement that reading portion of language arts curriculum include civics education content for all grade levels; provides requirements for civics education course that student must successfully complete for middle grades promotion; requires administration of end-of-course assessment in civics education as field test at middle school level, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1096 (SUB)** (Detert) and read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/SB 886 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Storms)—

OGSR/Insurance Claim Data Exchange Information; Amends a specified provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain records obtained by the Department of Revenue under an insurance claim data exchange system. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act. Extends the repeal date. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

Identical to **HB 7091 (HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Finance and Tax, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/HB 1291 (3R) by the Committee on Public Safety & Domestic Security Policy (CCJP), Representative Coley and others—

Domestic Violence Fatality Review Teams; Deletes requirement that Governor's Task Force on Domestic Violence provide information & technical assistance to local domestic violence fatality review teams; provides that information & records acquired by team are not subject to discovery or introduction into evidence in criminal or administrative proceedings in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **SB 1446 (SUB)** (Detert) and read the second time on April 16, 2010

SB 1816 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation (Gaetz)—

Assisted Living Facilities; Deletes the requirement for an assisted living facility to obtain an additional license in order to provide limited nursing services. Deletes the requirement for the AHCA to conduct quarterly monitoring visits of facilities that hold a license to provide extended congregate care services. Deletes the requirement for the DOEA to report annually on the status of and recommendations related to extended congregate care, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/SB 888 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Storms)—

OGSR/Information Held by Guardians Ad Litem; Amends a specified provision relating to an exemption from public records requirements for information regarding a child held by a guardian ad litem. Clarifies and reorganizes the exemption. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

Identical to **HB 7111 (HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Judiciary, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/CS/CS/SB 742 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Community Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Detert—

Public Safety Telecommunicators/E911; Includes dispatching as a function of E911 service. Includes fees for certification and recertification collected by the Department of Health in authorized expenditures for E911 services. Provides requirements for training and certification of a public safety telecommunicator, including fees. Requires certain 911 public safety telecommunicators to pass an examination administered by the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1706 (3R) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

State Financial Matters; Prohibits an agency or branch of state government, without legislative authority, from contracting to pay liquidated damages or early termination fees resulting from the breach or early termination of a contract or agreement, from paying interest because of insufficient budget authority to pay an obligation in the current year, from obligating the state to make future payments to cover unpaid balances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, ENVIRONMENT, AND LAND USE [EPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/CS/SB 218 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Health Regulation, Community Affairs, Senator Jones and others—

Medical Expenses/Inmates/County or Municipality; Requires that payments made by a county or municipality to a provider for certain services for an arrested person be made at a certain percentage of the Medicare allowable rate. Provides that this maximum allowable cap does not apply to physician payments for emergency services provided within a hospital emergency department. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/SB 602 (3R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations, Senator Justice and others—

Contamination Notification/Site Rehabilitation; Revises contamination notification provisions. Requires individuals responsible for site rehabilitation to provide notice of site rehabilitation to specified entities. Requires the DEP to provide specified notice to private K-12 schools and child care facilities. Authorizes the local government and the DEP to recover notification costs from responsible parties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/CS/SB 1004 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Senator Gelber and others—

Local Government; Authorizes a board of county commissioners to negotiate the lease of certain real property for alimited period. Authorizes transfers of right-of-way between local governments by deed. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

SB 1136 (3R) by Senator Crist-

Firesafety Inspections; Provides exceptions to certain local government firesafety inspection requirements. Specifies inspection requirements for fire hydrants owned by governmental entities. Authorizes local government utilities to comply using designated employees. Specifies responsibility for ensuring the qualification of designated employees to make inspections. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/HB 143 (3R) by the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Ray and others—

Aircraft Assembly & Manufacturing Hangars; Exempt hangars used to assemble or manufacture aircraft from transportation concurrency requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **SB 1518 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 16, 2010

CS/HB 7099 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Hukill and others—

Legislative Reauthorizations; Reauthorizes specified exemptions, 2-year extensions, & local comprehensive plan amendments granted, authorized, or adopted under general law &in effect as of specified date. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2452 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 16, 2010

SB 126 (3R) by Senator Bullard—

Community Redevelopment; Expands the definition of the term "blighted area" to include land previously used as a military facility. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 16, 2010

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, APRIL 21, 2010

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 2044 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Property Insurance; Delays the repeal of a provision exempting medical malpractice insurance premiums from emergency assessments to the Hurricane Catastrophe Fund. Revises the minimum surplus as to policyholders which must be maintained by certain insurers. Excludes certain premiums for federal multiple-peril crop insurance from calculations for an insurer's gross writing ratio. Removes an exception relating to the examination of managing general agents, etc. Effective Date: 06/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2232 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Guaranty Associations; Expands an exemption from the applicability of certain provisions of state law to include workers' compensation claims under employer liability coverage. Provides that certain provisions of state law do not prohibit the furnishing of certain information in a form prepared by the Florida Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association upon the request of a policyholder or applicant for insurance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 159 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 2046 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Employee Leasing Companies; Deletes the requirement that an employee leasing company obtain approval of the Board of Employee Leasing Companies before changing the name or location of a company. Specifies that the regulatory requirements applicable to employee leasing companies do not affect the eligibility of such companies, their clients, or leased employees for any local or state tax credit, economic incentive, or other benefit, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1660 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Richter)—

OGSR/Funeral, Cemetery, & Consumer Services Board; Amends specified provision which provides exemptions from public meetings and public records requirements for the Board of Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services within the DFS and for certain information held by the DFS. Requires a recording of a closed meeting of a probable cause panel of the board. Removes the scheduled repeal of exemptions within the section. Provides a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to **HB 7117 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/SB 1658 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Richter)—

OGSR/Hurricane Loss Model; Clarifies the public records exemption for a trade secret used in designing and constructing a hurricane loss model and provided by a private company to the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology, the OIR, or an appointed consumer advocate to specify that the exemption applies to trade secrets as defined in the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/1/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

Similar to **HB 7119 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/CS/SB 2264 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance and Senator Bennett—

Property Insurance Claims; Provides statements that may be considered deceptive or misleading if made in any public adjuster's advertisement or solicitation. Requires that a disclaimer be included in any public adjuster's written advertisement. Requires certain persons who act on behalf of an insurer to provide notice to the insurer, claimant, public adjuster, or legal representative for an onsite inspection of the insured property, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2011.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2230 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Pub. Rec./Examination Techniques & Procedures/OFR; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information that would reveal examination techniques and procedures used by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to the Florida Securities and Investor Protection Act. Provides an exception to the exemption for other governmental entities having oversight or regulatory or law enforcement authority. Provides for future review and repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

SB 1364 (SO) by Senator Thrasher—

Life Insurance; Specifies types of transactions for which a notice to the existing insurer of the replacement of a life insurance policy is not required. Revises a limitation on the amount of life insurance available for a covered spouse or dependent child under certain group life insurance policies. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Commerce

SB 2084 (SO) by Senator Richter—

Mortgage Guaranty Insurers/Surplus Requirements;

Authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance Regulation to permit a temporary exception to certain requirements under certain circumstances. Revises authority of the Office of Insurance Regulation to take action against a noncomplying insurer under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Finance and Tax, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1736 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Commerce and Senator Garcia—

Unemployment Compensation; Provides for retroactive application. Establishes temporary state extended benefits for weeks of unemployment. Provides for state extended benefits for certain weeks and for periods of high unemployment. Specifies the duration of liens securing the payment of unemployment compensation tax obligations. Provides for the treatment of a single-member limited liability company as the employer for purposes of unemployment compensation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1114 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Gelber and others—

International Commercial Arbitration; Cites this act as the "Florida International Commercial Arbitration Act." Defines the scope of application of said act. Provides intent that the act be applied and interpreted with respect to its purpose. Limits the ability of a court to intervene in an arbitral proceeding. 
