BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 2262 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Thrasher—

Charter Schools; Revises requirements for providing financial statements to the sponsor of a charter school. Authorizes a governing body to oversee multiple charter schools. Provides requirements for designation as a high-performing charter school. Authorizes such a charter school to increase enrollment and receive capital outlay funds. Provides for the establishment of charter virtual schools, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 22, 2010

SB 1258 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture (Dean)—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requires that the department and representatives of the state pest control industry prepare a report for the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of specified legislative committees by a certain date. Requires that the report include recommendations for changes in the law to provide for disciplinary action against licensees of pest control industry under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 23, 2010

CS/SB 1918 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Aronberg—

Traffic Offenses; Provides penalties for the commission of a noncriminal traffic infraction or certain other violations that cause or result in the serious injury of a motorcyclist, bicyclist, pedestrian, or person of other means of conveyance. Provides enhanced penalties for such violations that cause the death of such person. Provides that the act does not prohibit the person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2010; read the third time on April 26, 2010; and with pending amendment #3 (barcode 626924) by Senator Oelrich on April 27, 2010

CS/SB 1126 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Altman—

Permitting; Provides requirements for claiming certain site rehabilitation costs in applications for contaminated site rehabilitation tax credits. Clarifies duties of the OTTED to approve expedited permitting and comprehensive plan amendments. Revises criteria for businesses submitting permit applications or local comprehensive plan amendments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2010

SB 2252 (3R) by Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates the authority of members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires that persons addressing a legislative committee take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Provides criminal penalties for certain false statements before a legislative committee. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance card in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2010

HJR 7231 (3R) by the Committee on Select Policy Council on Strategic and Economic Planning and Representative Hukill—

Legislative and Congressional District Boundaries; Proposes creation of s. 20, Art. III of State Constitution to provide standards for establishing legislative & congressional district boundaries.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SJR 2288 (SUB)** (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 28, 2010

CS/HB 7179 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Energy & Utilities Policy (GGPC), Representative Precourt and others—

Qualifying Improvements to Real Property; Authorizes local government to levy non-ad valorem assessments to fund specified improvements to real property; authorizes property owners to enter into financing agreement with local government to finance specified improvements; authorizes local government to collect moneys for improvement purposes through non-ad valorem assessments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 2322 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 28, 2010; read the third time, amended, and with pending point of order by Senator Dean on pending amendment #2 (barcode 926992) by Senator Bennet on April 29, 2010

CS/SB 2410 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Motor Vehicle Dealers; Provides clarification regarding licensure renewal requirements. Requires the submission of an affidavit along with a license renewal application acknowledging that the provisions of the licensee's franchise agreements are consistent with the requirements of laws and rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 28, 2010; and read the third time on April 29, 2010

SB 838 (3R) by Senator Fasano and others—

University of South Florida/Doctor of Pharmacy; Authorizes a doctor of pharmacy degree program at the university. Provides for the program to be physically located on the new campus of the University of South Florida Polytechnic. Authorizes the university to develop and implement the program within existing facilities until a pharmacy facility is constructed on the new campus of the University of South Florida Polytechnic. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 28, 2010; and amended on April 29, 2010

CS/HB 7157 (3R) by the Committee on Government Operations Appropriations (CGHC), the Finance & Tax Council and Representative Fresen—

Taxation; Revises & creates various provisions of law relating to DOR's authority & duty to collect state taxes & administer & enforce state's tax laws; revises provisions excluding certain sales of tangible personal property to contractors from application of exemption for sales made to governmental entities under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **SB 1976 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

HB 7217 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council and Representative Nelson—

Hurricane Catastrophe Fund Emergency Assessments; Delays repeal of exemption from specified emergency assessments provided for medical malpractice insurance premiums & subjection of such premiums to emergency assessments. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1594 (SUB)** (Baker) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

HB 545 (3R) by Representative Patterson and others—

Residential Property Sales; Repeals provision requiring disclosures of residential property windstorm mitigation ratings to purchasers in wind-borne debris regions. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 2190 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/CS/SB 2138 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Gardiner—

Health Care; Repeals a provision relating to a prohibition against applying the Drug-Free Workplace Act retroactively. Establishes the physician workforce graduate medical education innovation pilot projects under the department. Requires persons who apply for licensure renewal as a dentist or dental hygienist to furnish certain information to the DOH in a dental workforce survey, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2010

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 1503 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/CS/HB 713 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council, the Committees on Government Operations Appropriations (CGHC), Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC) and Representative Workman—

Department of Business & Professional Regulation; Assigns certain programs to regulation by DBPR's Division of Professions; specifies that DBPR is responsible for regulation of certain professions & administration of certain examinations; authorizes DHSMV to issue reproductions of driver's licenses to DBPR; revises certain licensing & continuing education requirements; authorizes temporary licensure of spouses of active duty service members, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1330 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

HB 7219 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council and Representative Abruzzo—

Corporate Income Tax; Provides for adoption of 2010 version of Internal Revenue Code; provides for retroactive operation. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1912 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/HB 351 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA) and Representative Patterson—

Specialty License Plates; Creates Catch Me, Release Me license plate, Florida Horse Park license plate, & Florida Biodiversity Foundation license plate; establishes annual use fee for plates; provides for distribution of use fees received from sale of such plates; revises portion of use fees collected from sale of Florida Salutes Veterans license plate that shall be distributed to direct-support organization, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/SB 736 (SUB)** (Garcia) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

SB 2318 (3R) by Senator Storms and others-

Money Laundering; Defines the term "prosecuting authority" for purposes of the Florida RICO Act. Provides that the act be liberally construed to achieve the remedial purposes of curtailing racketeering activities and lessening the economic power of criminal organizations engaged in patterns of racketeering activities in this state. Prohibits a natural person from being licensed as a sole proprietorship or engaging in certain activities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/SB 2070 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Public Record Exemptions/Financial Regulation; Provides a public records exemption for information held by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to an investigation of consumer collection agencies. Provides for future repeal and legislative review of the exemption under the OGSR Act. Provides a statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/SB 198 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Baker—

Retirement/Special Risk Class; Authorizes certain employees to purchase the retirement credit for past service at a 3percent Special Risk Class accrual value. Provides requirements for calculating the first 2 percent of a member's average monthly compensation for purposes of purchasing past service credit. Provides that past service credit may be purchased by the member or by the employer on behalf of the member, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/CS/SB 296 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Wise—

State Attorneys; Deletes provisions that require each state attorney to submit on a quarterly basis deviation memoranda relating to offenders who are not sentenced to the mandatory minimum prisons sentence in cases involving the possession or use of a weapon and in cases involving certain specified offenses. Deletes provisions regarding the burden of establishing financial resources of the defendant, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 2592 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Baker—

Petroleum Contamination Site Cleanup; Requires the installation of fuel tank upgrades to secondary containment systems to be completed by specified deadlines. Revises provisions relating to petroleum contamination site selection and cleanup criteria. Deletes obsolete provisions relating to funding for limited interim soil-source removals. Provides for natural attenuation and active remediation of sites, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2010

Similar to CS/CS/HB 1385 (HC) in Messages

CS/HB 83 (3R) by the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Crisafulli and others—

Specialty License Plates; Creates Endless Summer license plate; establishes annual use fee for plate; provides for distribution of use fees received from sale of such plates. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Substituted for **SB 170 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

HB 1193 (3R) by Representative Plakon and others—

Retirement; Designates act "Adam Pierce Act"; provides statement of important state interest; revises definition of special risk member to include certain members suffering qualifying injury; provides eligibility requirements for membership in Special Risk Class for certain members suffering qualifying injury; provides medical certification requirements; provides definition; prohibits grant or creation of additional rights, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 1932 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/HB 119 (3R) by the Committees on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Public Safety & Domestic Security Policy (CCJP), Representative Glorioso and others—

Sexual Offenders and Predators; Prohibits loitering or prowling by certain offenders within specified distance of places where children were congregating; prohibits certain actions toward child at public park or playground by certain offenders; prohibits presence of certain offenders at child care facility or pre-K through 12 school without notice & supervision; provides exceptions; provides penalties, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1284 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/HB 7203 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Finance & Tax Council and Representative Bogdanoff—

Community Development Districts; Authorizes specified community development districts to levy tax on rental or license fee for use of real property; requires approval by district board of supervisors & district landowners; provides procedure to enact tax; provides for effective date of tax; provides for expiration of tax under specified circumstances; specifies uses of tax proceeds; requires prior approval by district board for expenditures of tax proceeds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1866 (SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/CS/CS/HB 663 (3R) by the Full Appropriations Council on Education & Economic Development, the General Government Policy Council, the Committees on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Aubuchon and others—

Building Safety; Revises provisions of law relating to elevator safety, home inspection services, mold assessment & remediation, & building code inspections & enforcement; provides for effect of expired, lapsed, nonrenewed, or revoked building permit; revises Florida Building Commission authority; exempts specified structures from Florida Building Code requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 648 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/HB 869 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representatives Eisnaugle, Rouson and others—

Campaign Financing; Provides alternative statement that may be used to identify candidate as sponsor of political advertisement under certain circumstances; provides circumstances under which certain campaign messages & political advertisements are not required to state or display specific information regarding identity of candidate, his or her party affiliation, & office sought in message or advertisement, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1672 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/HB 907 (3R) by the Committee on Civil Justice & Courts Policy (CCJP) and Representative Flores—

Child Support Guidelines; Requires all child support orders after certain date to contain certain provisions; provides principles for implementing support guidelines schedule; creates rebuttable presumption of census-level wages if information about earnings level is not provided; provides that burden of proof is on party seeking to impute income to other party; prohibits imputation of income for out-of-date records or unprecedented earnings, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2011.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2246 (SUB)** (Storms), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/HB 1411 (3R) by the Criminal & Civil Justice Policy Council, the Committee on Civil Justice & Courts Policy (CCJP) and Representative Dorworth—

Foreclosures; Provides requirements for officers, directors, & agents of timeshare owners' association; authorizes managing entity to bring judicial & trustee actions to foreclose certain liens; renames title of part III of ch. 721, to conform to changes made by act; establishes procedure for trustee foreclosure assessment liens & mortgage liens; provides for appointment of trustee; provides recording requirements for such liens, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2358 (SUB)** (Gardiner), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2010

CS/CS/HB 945 (3R) by the Committees on Health Care Appropriations (CGHC), Elder & Family Services Policy (HFPC), Representative Anderson and others—

Automated External Defibrillators/Assisted Living; Requires licensed ALFs with 17 beds or more to possess functioning automated external defibrillator; encourages location registration; provides immunity from liability under Good Samaritan Act & Cardiac Arrest Survival Act; authorizes DEA to adopt rules relating to use of automated external defibrillators. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2008 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/HB 1253 (3R) by the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Proctor and others—

Continuing Care Facilities; Revises provisions of law regulating continuing care facilities; increases threshold amount for businesses that must be identified in application for provisional certificate; revises financial information required annually for each certified facility; requires annual report to reflect changes in accounting principle terminology; authorizes provider to assess separate, nonrefundable fee for processing application for continuing care, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2030 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 29, 2010

CS/HB 7205 (3R) by the Full Appropriations Council on Education & Economic Development, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representatives Schenck, Holder and others—

Professional Sports Franchises; Amends specified provisions relating to OTTED, distribution of certain tax proceeds, &allocation of portion of local government half-cent sales tax; authorizes certain units of local government to apply for certification to receive state funding for facilities for spring training franchises; provides that OTTED may authorize direct-support organization to assist in retention of professional sports franchises, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/HB 927 (3R) by the Committees on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Civil Justice & Courts Policy (CCJP) and Representative Kiar—

Real Property; Revises criteria under which transfer of homestead property is not considered change of ownership; provides that change in ownership of nonhomestead residential property or nonresidential property is not deemed to have occurred due to certain transactions involving publicly traded company; provides that recorded deed or other instrument shall serve as notice of change of ownership, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SJR 1254 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Fasano and others—

Property/Annual Assessment/Exemption; Proposes amendments to the State Constitution to reduce from 10 percent to 5 percent the limitation on annual assessment increases applicable to nonhomestead real property, provide an additional homestead exemption for new owners of homestead property and application and limitations with respect thereto.

Credit Cards/Fraudulently Taking or Using; Provides that a person who takes a credit card from the possession, custody, or control of another without the cardholder's consent, who possesses, receives or retains custody of the credit card with the knowledge that it has been taken, or who receives the credit card with the intent to use it, to sell it, or to transfer it to a person other than the issuer or the cardholder commits a felony of the third degree, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (barcode 695602) by Senator Storms on April 28, 2010

Compare to CS/CS/CS/HB 621 (HC) in the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/CS/SB 924 (SO) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Transportation and Senator Wise—

Driver's Licenses; Provides procedures for the restoration of the driving privileges of certain persons whose driving privileges have been revoked. Provides for a hearing. Provides for the adoption of rules. Provides a phase-in period. Requires the installation of an ignition interlock device under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 382 (SO) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Community Affairs, Agriculture and Senator Dean—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requires the FWC to enter into an agreement with the DEP relating to the uniform application of pesticides to the waters of the state. Revises a reference to the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes. Revises citizenship requirements and documentation for certain private investigative, private security, and recovery agent licenses. Prohibits persons from engaging in sexual activities with animals, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time, amended, and with pending amendment #2 (barcode 237206) by Senator Dean and pending amendment to amendment #2c (barcode 183578) by Senator Bennett on April 29, 2010

Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 1445 (HC)** in the Committees on Agriculture, Community Affairs, and Health Regulation

CS/SB 220 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Fasano—

Tax On Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Deletes a requirement that a specified penalty is mandatory and may not be waived by the DOR. Deletes authorization to return certain aircraft to the state for repairs without liability for taxes and penalties under certain circumstances. Exempts from the use tax aircraft that are owned by nonresidents and that enter and remain in the state for certain purposes under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time on April 28, 2010

Similar to CS/HB 173 (HC) in Messages

CS/CS/CS/HB 631 (SO) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committees on Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations (CEED), Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Burgin and others—

Motor Vehicles; Removes requirement that HSMV adopt uniform written notice to be used to enforce provisions that prohibit parking motor vehicle on certain property for purpose of displaying motor vehicle as being for sale, hire, or rental; removes requirement that each law enforcement agency provide its own notice for such enforcement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1182 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (barcode 852148) by Senator Crist on April 29, 2010

SB 978 (SO) by Senator Fasano—

License Plates/Fraternal Order of Police; Creates a Fraternal Order of Police license plate. Establishes an annual use fee for the plate. Provides for the distribution of use fees received from the sale of the plate. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation, Criminal Justice, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

Compare to **CS/HB 289 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Criminal Justice, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 364 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Fasano—

Instant Bingo Tickets; Authorizes the dispensing of instant bingo tickets by electronic or mechanical devices. Requires that such devices be capable of recording certain transaction information. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committees on Judiciary and General Government Appropriations report the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 1016 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Judiciary, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—

Mobile Home Park Tenancies; Directs the Florida Housing Finance Corporation to provide technical assistance to mobile home owners in purchasing their mobile home park. Provides legislative findings. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided an eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park. Requires certain notice to the homeowners' association. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 1144 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Smith—

Driving Safety/Ronshay Dugans Act; Creates the "Ronshay Dugans Act." Designates Drowsy Driving Prevention Week. Encourages the HSMV and the DOT to educate the law enforcement community and the public about the relationship between fatigue and driving performance. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and withdrawn from the Committees on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 1472 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce, Senator Detert and others—

Research Commercialization Matching Grant Program; Creates the Florida Research Commercialization Matching Grant Program. Specifies procedures for processing program applications. Provides eligibility guidelines for applicants. Provides for a program administrator. Provides responsibilities of such administrator. Provides for certain contracts. Provides for program administrative costs. Provides for grant awards up to a specified amount, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 2072 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Public Record Exemptions/Financial Regulation; Provides a public records exemption for information held by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to an investigation of debt relief organizations. Provides for future repeal and legislative review of the exemption under the OGSR Act. Provides a statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 2120 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce, Senator Justice and others—

Cadmium in Children's Products; Prohibits a person from using or applying cadmium in excess of a specified amount on any item of children's jewelry, toy, or child care article sold in this state. Provides an exception. Provides for a criminal penalty. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/SB 2618 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bennett—

Warranty Associations; Provides penalties for certain licensure violations. Prohibits service agreement companies from issuing certain deceptive advertisements, operating without asubsisting license, or remitting premiums to a person other than the obligated service agreement company. Deletes a requirement that certain service agreement forms be approved by the OIR of the Financial Services Commission, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

SB 2734 (2R) by Senator Constantine-

Workers' Compensation Joint Underwriting Assoc.; Deletes an obsolete transitional requirement for certain policies of the Florida Workers' Compensation Joint Underwriting Association. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Commerce

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, ENVIRONMENT, AND LAND USE [EPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1882 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Gaetz and others—

State Park Designations/Bob Graham/Jack Mashburn; Designates the Bob Graham Grayton Beach State Park in Walton County. Designates the Jack Mashburn Marina within St. Andrew's State Park. Directs the Department of Environmental Protection to erect appropriate signs and markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation

CS/CS/SB 2354 (2R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Sobel—

Sewage Disposal Facilities; Requires entities that divert wastewater from facilities discharging domestic wastewater through ocean outfalls to meet specified reuse requirements. Provides that such reuse contributes to the reuse requirement of the facilities originally accepting the flows. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

SB 2372 (2R) by Senator Rich-

Animal Control or Cruelty Ordinances; Requires a county or municipality enacting an ordinance relating to animal control or cruelty to impose a specified surcharge on the civil penalty for violations of the ordinance. Specifies use of the proceeds of the surcharge. Provides construction. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs and Judiciary

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

SM 96 (2R) by Senator Baker and others-

Exercise of Federal Power; Urges the Congress of the United States to honor the provisions of the Constitution of the United States and United States Supreme Court case law which limit the scope and exercise of federal power.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 184 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Joyner and others—

Adolescent Offenders/Parole; Provides that an adolescent offender who was 15 years of age or younger at the time of commission of an offense and who is sentenced to life or asingle or cumulative term of 10 years or more in prison is eligible for parole if the offender has been incarcerated for a minimum period and has not previously been convicted of or adjudicated delinquent for certain offenses. Provides for retroactive application, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

SB 208 (2R) by Senator Oelrich-

Community College Student Fees/Transportation; Authorizes community college boards of trustees to establish a transportation access fee. Limits the amount of the fee. Provides a timeframe for a fee increase and implementation of an increase. Prohibits the inclusion of the fee in calculating the amount a student receives under Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program awards. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 620 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Higher Education, Health Regulation, the Committee on Health Regulation and others—

Biomedical Research Programs; Deletes provisions requiring that the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program be funded by proceeds from the Lawton Chiles Endowment Fund. Increases the funding available to the Florida Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease. Revises the purpose of the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program. Creates the Cancer Control Collaborative Program within the Department of Health, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 942 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Sobel—

Practice of Tattooing; Exempts certain personnel who perform tattooing for medical or dental purposes from regulation under specified provisions. Prohibits the practice of tattooing except by a person licensed or registered by the DOH. Requires tattoo artists to complete an education course and pass an examination. Requires the licensure of permanent tattoo establishments and temporary establishments, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2012.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committees on Finance and Tax, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1256 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Peaden—

Physician Workforce; Repeals provisions relating to the program for graduate medical education innovations and the graduate medical education committee and report. Requires the DOH to coordinate and enhance activities regarding the reentry of retired military and other physicians into the physician workforce. Revises the standards for the Board of Medicine to issue a temporary certificate to certain physicians to practice medicine in areas of critical need, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Higher Education reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

SB 2244 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs—

Independent Living Transition Services Program; Requires the Auditor General to perform an operational audit of the independent living transition services program administered by the DCFS. Requires the OPPAGA to conduct an evaluation of the said program administered by the DCFS. Requires that the results of the audit and evaluation be reported to the Governor, the Legislature, and the Secretary of Children and Family Services. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 2276 (2R) by Senator Negron-

Judiciary; Repeals specified provisions relating to regular terms of the Supreme Court, compensation of the marshal, census commissions for the judicial circuits, and terms of the circuit courts. Repeals specified provisions relating to requiring a judge to attend the first day of each term of the circuit court and calling all cases on the docket at the end of each term, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 664 (2R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Altman and others—

Property Taxation; Tolls the statute of limitations relating to proceedings involving tax lien certificates or tax deeds by the period of an intervening bankruptcy. Revises provisions relating to applications for tax deeds. Provides that the authority of the governing body of a county or municipality to grant certain ad valorem tax exemptions may be renewed for multiple 10-year periods upon approval by referendum, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1128 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Senator Altman—

Admissions Tax; Expands an exemption from the tax for certain sports championships or all-star games, certain other professional sporting events, and events surrounding certain professional sporting events. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and withdrawn from the Committees on Finance and Tax, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 2006 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Senator Lynn—

Admissions Tax/Educational Events; Exempts from the tax admission charges to certain educational events. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committees on Finance and Tax, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

SB 2356 (2R) by Senator Sobel-

Educational Plant Surveys; Authorizes an extension to a school district educational plant survey submission deadline. Provides requirements for the submission of a request for an extension to the Department of Education and requiring department approval. Provides restrictions on school district construction during the extension period. Requires the State Board of Education to adopt rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 and Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means


